FPCC FIELD TRIPS FOR MAY AND JUNE 2013

Monday-Wednesday, May 13 - 15

2-Night stay in Warrenton, Oregon, just south of Astoria. Lodging at Shilo Inn (less than 6 miles to Peter Iredale wreck):

A block of 10 rooms at \$89/night (does not include taxes) has been set aside for FPCC members. If you are interested, you must call the hotel directly at 503/861-2181 to get this rate. You must also specify whether you want a king bed and sofa or two queens. All rooms have microwave, mini fridge and coffee maker. Continental breakfast included. Rooms must be booked before 4/29.

More info: ADA compliant rooms are available, WIFI-no code required. Cell phone and laptops should work normally.

This memorial/mausoleum was founded in 1901, so there are wonderful architectural details, inside and out....stained glass by L. C. Tiffany & the Povey Brothers, marble that was hand-carved in Italy. The grounds and interior will be open to the public over Memorial Day Weekend. We will be granted access at 9 am.


Karen McClymonds from Portland Photographic Society has generously offered to share a CD of her WPM photography. Our EID Chair John Craig will show this after competition on April 16.

Thursday, May 30

Twilight on the Willamette

Rose Festival City Fair with Ferris wheel and other attractions at Tom McCall Waterfront Park. We'll find parking further north to catch the excitement across the river. There are wonderful Rose Festival shots at Bing Images.



Tuesday, June 11

Peninsula Park-the first public rose garden in Portland. Centennial celebrations will take place later in June.

Monday, June 17

Twilight on the Willamette-we'll determine a spot after May's night out.

2 nights in Colfax, WA to explore the Palouse region THEN 2 nights near Joseph, OR for relaxation on Wallowa Lake & exploring Hell's Canyon. (Day-use permits will be needed at Steptoe Butte & other spots.)

Lodging for Palouse region in Colfax, WA: Best Western Plus Wheatland Inn

A block of 12 rooms at \$98.99/night (does not include taxes) has been set aside for FPCC members. If you are interested, you must call the hotel directly at 503/397-0397 to get this rate. You must specify whether you want a king bed or two queens. All rooms have microwave, mini fridge and coffee maker. Hot breakfast included. Rooms must be booked before 5/23*.

More info: Two ADA-compliant rooms are available. WiFi, cell phone and laptops should work normally.

Check-in: 3 pm

Check-out: Noon

Lodging near Joseph, OR: Trouthaven

Trouthaven offers the only cabins on the west side of Wallowa Lake. There are 4 small cabins & 5 large cabins.

Rates shown on link are quite reasonable, especially if cabins are shared. Greg & Gail, our hosts, have reduced the deposit fee from \$200 to \$100 on each cabin rental, just for us. However, they have asked that there be only one contact person per cabin. If you have a group interested in sharing a cabin, they will need to know # of occupants for each cabin. You must contact our hosts & send a deposit check prior to 4/25*. (FYI, cabin photos show open doorways. However, all bathrooms have doors; doorways to bedrooms have curtains. Remember, these were built in simpler times.) No need to worry about small things like dish soap or warm blankets. Gail said to bring only your clothes, food & coffee (percolator in each cabin-drip grind will work.) Downtown Joseph is also close by if you'd rather eat out.

RELAXATION means no WiFi, no TV, no whining go-carts (quite common at other lodging around Wallowa), covered porches,

camp fire, lawn area with picnic tables, short-not steep-walk to lake front.
Please note that there are a few steps up to each cabin. One of the smaller cabins has a handrail but there are a few more stairs. There is a very slight grade on the walking trail down to the lake. There's also a handrail most of the way down.

Check-in: Noon (just for us)
Check-out: 11 am

Some families have been coming back for decades, one for over 4 decades!


*The folks at Truthaven are expecting another grandchild some time after 4/13. Gail will be in Boise with cell phone and computer to assist us.
