Thoughts from the President

This last month the club purchased a backup bulb for our projector. So if the projector bulb goes during a competition night we should be able to replace the bulb with only a brief interruption.

Don't forget the 4C's convention in Longview Oct. 7-9. Go to the 4C's web site for details (<http://columbiacameraclubs.org/>) and click the "Conventions" link.

Our EID (electronic imaging division) has 2 categories - Traditional & Creative). I notice that pictures are sometimes entered into the wrong category. The EID chair will accept images as entered without comment as to if they are really appropriate to the category. But your picture will most likely receive more points by being entered into the correct category. The club 4C's and PSA competitions that we participate in do not recognize multiple categories. If your picture is forwarded onto 4C's or PSA its category designation is removed. So how do you determine if your picture is "Creative" or "Traditional"? Good Question and not an easy one to answer. We follow the 4C's and PSA guidelines. If a picture represents altered reality it is creative. The creative designation is not determined on how the picture was taken or how it was altered. It is how the picture appears to the viewer. B&W pictures are not "Creative" even though it can be argued they are altered reality.

The interpretation of the term "altered reality" does not means that the saturation, contrast and sharpness has been adjusted. Adding elements to an picture does not make it creative. Film Pack's Creative picture of the year last year had very little done to it. But it did not look like reality. It was a picture of the entrance to the Beatles show "Love" in Las Vegas. Altering a picture a lot or very little does not determine a pictures category. Subjective evaluation of whether the picture looks like something you experience in daily life does.

Film Pack participates with King City Camera Club, Forest Grove Camera Club and Portland Photographic Society in judging each other pictures. We go judge their pictures and they come and judge ours. Don Funderburg is coordinating our judging this year. Judging is a great experience because you learn to evaluate pictures using club criteria. If you want to be a better club photographer, go and judge other clubs pictures. Let Don know you are available to participate in club judging.

I considered buying a new printer last month. It took some thinking about whether I wanted to print my own pictures or send them out for printing. Printing pictures on your own printer is a complicated affair. That is because it is unlikely that if you just plug a printer in to your computer and start printing away that the colors and luminance on your print will look much like those on your monitor - especially if your monitor is not calibrated. Better printers can produce a larger color gamut (more colors) than your monitor. Unless you set your printer up correctly it is going to automatically adjust your colors using one of several options that the printer may be set to by default. Most printers out of the box are setup to change the colors received from your computer. I don't know why manufacturers do this because it causes problems. But that is the way it is. Also the paper being printed on will affect the color rendition.

I finally bought a printer and went through the pain, time and cost of profiling it to each of the papers I use. Most paper manufacturers have profiles for the common printers available for downloading but they are not perfect. Each printer is unique. For most people I do not recommend buying your own photo printer. Costco does a great job of printing and you can download their printer profiles and adjust your picture before you upload it to Costco for printing. Other sources are available to print your images but I do not know if you can download their printer profiles. Costco prices are very reasonable. John Craig has offered to demonstrate how he prepares and downloads his Costco prints at one of our future programs.


